

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Abstract

This project examines the states that exist between the virtual and the real, as well as between introversion and extroversion, focusing on spatial transitions experienced by text creators. Using Bras Basah Complex as a base, it discusses the definitions of work and living spaces. My design intervention emphasizes the façade created by the building's windows and corridors, aiming to disrupt the living and working environments of text creators. By integrating residential units with the podium roof, the design connects public and private areas while activating surrounding living spaces through this in-between zone, thereby promoting interaction among residents. This dynamic also influences the creativity and productivity of text creators. The design strategy addresses the blurred boundaries of work and life in the post-pandemic era, challenges the binary oppositions present in Singapore's spatial strategies, and proposes new ways of existing in the transitional space between work and life.


This project emphasizes the significance of preserving existing buildings rather than opting for demolition. While tearing down structures might seem like a quick fix, it is an irreversible action that erases valuable materials, memories, and history. Instead, the project advocates for the transformation and adaptive reuse of existing structures, which proves to be a more economical, ecological, and creative approach. In this instance, three modernist social housing buildings in Bordeaux were renovated, showcasing the potential of revitalizing old structures to serve contemporary needs while honoring their past.




Old Facade of Transformation of 530 Dwellings



Renovated Facade of Transformation of 530 Dwellings







Overlay / In-between

In my initial research, I explored the fusion of old and new spatial elements by combining photographs from different time periods into a single image. This method provided a visual and analytical framework to examine the impact of newly introduced spaces on existing historical environments.

The original spaces were marked by a dense, chaotic layout, where living and working areas were tightly intertwined. This lack of separation created an overwhelming sense of congestion, with people conducting their daily activities in spaces that blurred the boundaries between professional and personal life.

The addition of new architectural elements disrupted this established order, reshaping the perception and functionality of the original areas. Through this transformation, I identified two key outcomes that emerged from this spatial evolution.





Firstly, the newly introduced spaces brought much-needed flexibility to the original areas. This integration allowed for a reorganization that revitalized the existing spaces while establishing clear, functional boundaries. The reconfiguration separated work zones from living areas, transforming a previously chaotic environment into one that was more structured and harmonious. This newfound flexibility enhanced the efficiency and comfort of the overall space, accommodating evolving needs and fostering adaptability over time.

Secondly, the introduction of these new spaces transformed the relationship between indoor and outdoor environments. This interplay created transitional layers that users could actively navigate, ranging from fully enclosed interiors to semi-open areas that seamlessly connect with the outdoors. These gradations blurred the boundaries between interior and exterior, offering a dynamic and fluid spatial experience.

I coined this transitional zone the "Gap Space" or "Space In-Between." Acting as a buffer or bridge, it enables a nuanced interaction between the built environment and its natural surroundings. Within these in-between spaces, the most innovative and adaptable uses emerge, providing both flexibility and a fresh way of experiencing the connection between indoor and outdoor realms.




Singapore HDB **Podium Block**

Bras Basah Complex is a mixed-use building located on Bain Street in Bras Basah, Singapore, featuring both residential and commercial units. My project will focus specifically on the podium roof, corridors, and façade of the complex. It aims to explore the in-between spaces within this environment, reimagining the dynamics between work and life, private and public spheres, as well as the relationship between writers and their audience.


At BBC, many shop tenants lived above their stores, creating a balance between work and life. Today, however, outdated facilities and shifting shopping habits have led to bookstore closures and new challenges for tenants. These changes highlight the need to reimagine the integration of work and living spaces in the area.



PRESENT: Residentail and Commercial

Bras Basah Complex possesses the highest commercial-residential floor area ratio (53.7%) amongst similar development typologies in the city. Allocating over 90% of the shop mix in the podium to book trade in the renewal programme, it has since shifted to accomodate a more diverse range of arts and cultural related shops. pore's annual Light to Night Festival.

As a HDB Development, Bras Basah Complex underwent upgrading programs such as the Home Improvement Programme (HIP) in 2012 which aimed to resolve maintenance issues of ageing flats, and the Lift Upgrading Programme (LUP) in 2019, to provdie direct lift access for all apartments in 232 and 233 BainStreet.Thecommercial podium underwent HDB's Revitalisation of Shops (ROS) Scheme in two batches; one in 2009 and a major facelift, in 2013








Book Industry / Flexibility / Engagement

Book industry encompass a wide range of roles, including authors (for online content and books), editors, magazine editors, bloggers, publishers and sellers. While there are many types of creators, I want to focus specifically on those in the physical book industry. A common characteristic among the job types I mentioned is the freedom to arrange their work and rest schedules. They often shift between different modes of working, as they need to dedicate considerable time to thinking, editing, and proofreading—personal tasks—while also engaging in social activities and public speaking that require interaction with others.



Through the lens of the "In-between," the boundaries between work and life, private and public, as well as between writers and readers, can be redefined.

Stage of Publising, Space research


The concept of the "Inbetween" reflects how writers navigate shifting states—balancing personal creation with public engagement, moving between solitude and interaction. This perspective redefines boundaries between work and life, private and public, and writers and readers.

In Bras Basah, Gap spaces illustrate this dynamic, blending contrasts like indoor and outdoor, private and public, and virtual and real. These transitional spaces shape experiences, facilitating movement between environments and revealing opportunities for innovative design.

Through studying the lifecycle of books, I mapped activities along a public-to-private spectrum. Writers require four key spaces: private creation zones, areas for observation and inspiration, collaborative spaces, and venues for public interaction.








Facade Circulation My design intervention focuses on two key elements: façade and circulation. This approach aligns with the spatial progression I've analyzed within the Bras Basah Complex (BBC), moving from private individual rooms to public commercial units, creating a journey from intimacy to openness. I aim to incorporate this sequence into the complex's spatial design.

Design Strategy


To address circulation, I developed a spatial hierarchy that balances the interplay between commercial and residential spaces. Public and private zones are distinctly separated across different floors, with ground-level commercial areas reimagined for interaction and sales. The upper levels feature façade installations that create connections between residents and the public.




A central atrium anchors the design, integrating the spaces both vertically and horizontally. The building's façade reflects the essence of the publishing industry, visually tying the design to its thematic inspiration.



Sketch, Corridor and Window








Tetris Facade


The façade design unfolds in two stages.

In the first, I conceptualize the façade as a Tetrislike arrangement, with each "block" resembling a uniquely sized book. To achieve this, I analyzed the original unit layout and developed a new organizational logic, combining four distinct unit types to create a façade rich in variety.


























New Structure

In the second stage, I designed a new structure consisting of three parts: a scaffold-like framework with walkways, an adjustable façade, and a modular "bookshelf" unit in between. This setup enables interior units to serve as both residences and interactive spaces for writers to engage with the public. When closed, the façade signals privacy, indicating the writer is working. When opened, a panel lowers to connect with the walkway, inviting visitors inside like an open house. The hanging modular units can transform into tables, chairs, or bookshelves, adapting to the residents' desired level of interaction.




regular residents, For the opening and closing facade not only serves as an extendable balcony but also acts as a barrier against external disturbances. The units hung on the facade can move in the direction of the vertical plane. When the facade is closed, they can be used for the exterior corridor, and when the facade is open, they can retract to serve as seating for the balcony.




The home serves as an independent creative space, with a small balcony extending outward to draw inspiration from the outside during the creative process. At the same time, this space can also be used for everyday household tasks











Side Unit



Repurposing the noisier spaces located along circulation paths, which are less suitable for residential use, into more affordable rental offices with public interaction. These offices, like before, use outwardextending platforms to connect indoor activities with the outside environment.











Open and Closed


This design enables the interior units to serve as both private residences and interactive spaces for writers to engage with the public. When closed, it signals that the unit is private, suggesting the writer is focused on work. When opened, a panel lowers to connect with the walkway, inviting visitors inside like an open house. The hanging modular units can transform into tables, chairs, or bookshelves, adapting to the residents' preferred level interaction.



Public & Private, Unit Plan Drawing



By redesigning and reorganizing inbetween spaces, it blurs the boundaries between living and working, fostering integration and adaptability. Additionally, the project reinterprets the Old City Podium Block's role and relevance in today's evolving urban and cultural context.
